The Branch is hosting the Zone 6 Show on 22 May and final planning for the event is well under way (see page 2 for more details).

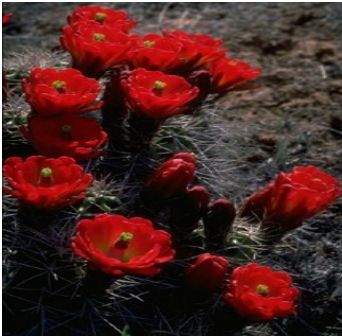

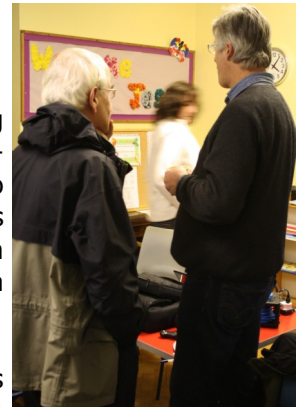

Tina Wardhaugh from Northampton and Milton Keynes Branch visited us and a potential new member came along for the first time.

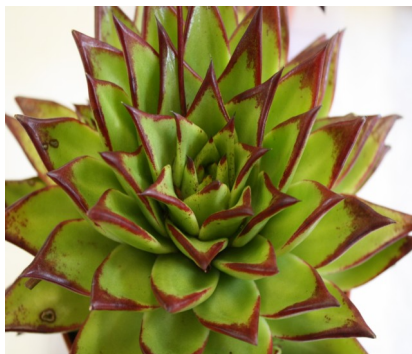
## Xmas Get-Together

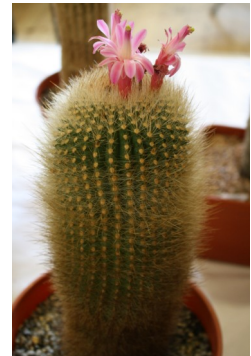

3rd place	Julian Cooke



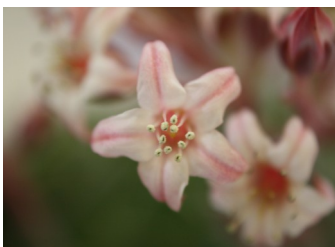
## Forthcoming Meetings
