Zone 6 Convention 2013

Jakob and Peter are excellent speakers and should provide many new insights into our favourite plants and their habitats.

My favourite plants #3 - Pelecyphora valdeziana **By Julian Cooke**

As I write this there is deep snow outside yet already the plant I am featuring is in bud. You have probably already guessed that the plant I am talking

about is Pelecyphora valdeziana. Now it is regarded as a Turbinicarpus and comes from Nuevo Leon, Coahuila in Mexico.

There is no excuse for not having at least one in any collection as it will never outgrow a 6cm pot so finding space is

never an issue. The plant itself is finger thick and up to about 2 cms high. Each areole is adorned with a large number of very short almost hair like white spines that together mostly obscure the body. Underneath there is a fleshy root. Buds are often visible in the crown at Christmas

and it usually flowers in March heralding the start of the growing season for me.

Cultivation is relatively easy although I always add just

that little extra grit and go easy on the water if it is very dull. The plant is easily grown from seed. The seeds are relatively large and brown/black and germinate very readily. With a push it will flower in 2 years although 3 is more likely. Flowers are large for the

size of the plant being about 1.5 cms across. The colour ranges from pale purple through pink often with a darker mid stripe on the petals through to white

> (the so called albiflora). If you don't fancy growing from seed, the plant is widely available from many cactus suppliers, which is good as it is probably not the longest lived plant. 10-15 years is probably its limit but if you

have two then you can easily set your own seed. Indeed if you do have several why not grow them in a pan.

The plant featured is in a 5 cm pot and is about 8 years old.
